Proclamation.

By His Excellency Charles FitzGerald, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral-of the same.

N. pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the 1mperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian colonies." I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Col-lector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated 14th June, 1843.

By the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday, the 3rd September next,— Swan Location No. 120.—Comprising 16 acres more or less, in form of an average square with frontage on the shore of Melville Water, the West boundary extending North from the same through the stem of a marked flooded gum tree, nearly a quarter of a mile below Gallop's Location.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD. Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

THEREAS by the 2nd section of an VV Ordinance passed in the 12th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria No. 19, entitled "An Ordinance to provide for the establishment of Pilotage Fees and Light Dues." It is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of his Executive Council to rescind or alter the scale of Pilotage Fees or Harbour Dues imposed by such Ordinance. Now therefore, I the Governor, by virtue of the power in me vested by such Ordinance, do hereby rescind and annul from the date of this my Proclamation, all Pilotage Fees and Harbour Dues imposed by such Ordinance on Vessels entering into or using any of the Harbours, Roadsteads, or Auchorages in King George's Sound.

IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information, that under the provisions of the 12th section of an Ordinance passed in the 14th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 20, intituled "An Ordinance for the establishment of further precautionary regulations for the Port of Fremantle," the following have been respectively appointed as places for landing from or embarking in boats between sunset and sunrise, namely: the Jetty near the Water Police Barracks in the South Bay, and a spot indicated by a spar fixed in the ground abreast of Mr Davey's house on the river side, and any person who shall without lawful excuse land or embark between sunset and sunrise at any other place than those hereinbefore appointed, shall on conviction thereof before any two Justices of the

Peace forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding ten pounds; and every person so landing or embarking between sunset and sunrise shall report immediately the fact of such landing or the intention of such embarkation to the Superintendent of Water Police, and any person neglecting or refusing so to do shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.
