Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD. Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

N pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the 1mperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian colonies." I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Col-lector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated 14th June, 1843.

T is hereby notified for general information, that it is intended to complete a survey as soon as possible, of the following line of road, to be thereupon cleared and opened for use as a public line of communication, pursuant to the provisions of existing Ordinances.

The road to be one chain in width, extending from the new Bridge on the Upper Swan to the located lands around Gingin, and passing eastward of Ellen's Brook through Swan location 91, on the east sides of locations 105 and 106, and of Lake Bamban, through location 96, and westward of 103, to location 101 at Gingin.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, made and issued on the 22nd day of March, 1850, for the Leasing of Crown Lands in the Australian Colonies, and which Order was duly published in the Government Gazette of 13th December, 1850, and 26th August, 1851, respectively, it is ordered that from and after the Proclamation of such Order in the Colony of Western Australia, the rules and regulain the chapters therein contained shall in the said Colony of Western Australia have the force and effect of law. NOW therefore I, the Governor, do hereby Proclaim such Order accordingly.
