IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian colonies." Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS in the 12th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, an Ordinance was passed by me the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said colony of Western Australia, intituled "An Ordinance for regulating the Police in Western Australia." And whereas provision is made in clause XL of such Ordinance for extending all or some of the powers thereof to other Towns within the said colony than those named in the said Ordinance. Now therefore I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim the said Ordinance and all the powers and provisions therein contained, to apply to and

be in force within the Towns of York, Toodyay, and Bunbury, after the expiration of thirty days from the publication of this my Proclamation.
