*By His Excellency* CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in  
and over the Territory of Western Australia  
and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS in the 12th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, an Ordinance was passed by me the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said colony of Western Australia, intituled "An Ordinance for regulating the Police in Western Australia." And whereas provision is made in clause XL of such Ordinance for extending all or some of the powers thereof to other Towns within the said colony than those named in the said Ordinance. Now therefore I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim the said Ordinance and all the powers and provisions therein contained, to apply to and be in force within the Towns of York, Toodyay, and Bunbury, after the expiration of thirty days from the publication of this my Proclamation.

#### Proclamation.

*By His Excellency* CHARLES FITZGERALD,  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in  
and over the Territory of Western Australia,  
and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the 10th clause of an Ordinance passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 19, the Governor is empowered to establish, rescind, or alter by Proclamation, any of the Tolls, rates, dues or charges, that may be payable at or by means of any lines or modes of communication throughout the colony, Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the power in me vested, do hereby order and proclaim that from and after the 31st day of December, instant, the charge to be demanded and paid at the Canning Bridge and Perth Causeway, respectively, for every Score of Sheep passing over the same, shall be increased to the sum of Tenpence, in lieu of the rate hitherto levied.
