#### Proclamation.

*By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

WHEREAS an Act was passed by the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, in the 13th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 21, intituled "an act for incorporating the Colonization Assurance Company, and conferring certain privileges on the said company," And whereas by the 15th section of such act, it is enacted, that the said Act shall take effect and have the force of law in each of the colonies and dependencies of the British empire, from the date of the receipt by the Governor thereof of a copy of the said Act, which

day shall be notified by proclamation, Now therefore, I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim that I have this day received a copy of the said Act, and that it is and shall be in force in the colony of Western Australia and its dependencies from this date, and all rights, powers, and privileges vested by the said Act in such Corporation, shall and may be exercised and enjoyed by them accordingly.

#### Proclamation.

*By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia, and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

WHEREAS by the 10th clause of an Ordinance passed in the tenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 19, the Governor is empowered to establish, rescind, or alter by Proclamation, any of the Tolls, rates, dues or charges, that may be payable at or by means of any lines or modes of communication throughout the colony, Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the power in me vested, do hereby proclaim and make known that the toll ordered by my proclamation bearing date 13th of Dec., instant, to be demanded and paid at the Canning Bridge and Perth Causeway, respectively, for every Score of Sheep passing over the same, is hereby rescinded, and that the original charge of Threepence per score shall still remain in force.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the following letter addressed by Assistant Surveyor A. Gregory, to the Honorable the Surveyor General, relative to a projected line of road from Perth to King George's Sound, to be published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honor to report my return from the examination of the country between the Swan and Hotham rivers, with the

view of ascertaining the facilities which exist for opening a direct line of communication between Perth and Albany.

Following the present line of road from Perth to the Canning, it passes over about four miles of sandy country; after which the soil is a firm clay; at eleven miles the line crosses the Canning river, which will require a bridge, the most eligible position for which appears to be about four miles below Kelmscott; the road then continues along the left bank of the river, as far as that townsite, then along the foot of the Darling range for two miles, and ascends the hills by an easy slope, following the valley of the Neeregan brook through Location No. 23, to the termination of the present cart track, at Batt's water-mill. From this point the line takes a SE direction, for 14 miles, to clear the deep ravines which intersect the country near the Western declivity of the range, then changing the direction SSE for about 15 miles, to Mount Randall.

This part of the line would require little besides the removal of the fallen timber and loose blocks of stone, to form an excellent road, the gradients never exceeding 1 in 10.

The country consists of ironstone and gravel, hills thickly timbered with mahogany, and is well watered by small streams and springs.

Having on several previous occasions traversed the country between the Hotham and Kojenup, I am enabled to state that no obstacle exists, to the formation of a nearly direct line of firm road between these places, as shewn by the dotted red line on the accompanying sketch.

This direct line effects a saving of more than forty miles as compared with that by York, and about 57 miles with that by Bunbury, this latter being also sandy for nearly a hundred miles, and the ascent of the Darling Range very steep, precludes it being travelled with a speed equal to either the direct route, or that by York.

With regard to the bridges which will have to be constructed, the line by Bunbury has the advantage, as the Mandurah ferry, and the Collie bridge perfect the line in this respect, as far as Bunbury, and from that place to Kojenup, would require a bridge at the Ferguson, a second at the upper part of the Collie while the Blackwood presents the only considerable obstacle, from the high floods to which that river is subject. The direct line by Williamsburgh requires bridges over the Canning, Hotham, Williams, Arthur and Beaufort, though none of these rivers are one third the size of the Blackwood.

Enclosed is a tracing shewing the relative position and distances of the several places, and lines referred to.
