Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia, and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843

At Perth, on Wednesday, the 7th April next:—

*Avon Location No. 93—*Comprising 10 acres more or less, extending 10 chains NNW, and 10 chains WSW from a spot 2 chains SSE from South corner of Avon Location No. 82, opposite boundaries parallel and equal, and all boundaries magnetic. Upset price £1 per acre.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were made and passed by me the said Governor, with the advice

and consent of the Legislative Council of the said colony, in the 14th year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, namely:—

14th Vict. No. 2, "An Ordinance to provide for the establishment of a Scale of Pilotage and Light Dues."

14th Vict. No. 11, "An Ordinance to extend the Law of Quarantine."

Now I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to allow and confirm the same respectively.
