Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
and over the Territory of Western Aus-
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-
ted by a certain Act of the Imperial
Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th
years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled
"An Act for regulating the sale of Waste
Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-
tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and
proclaim that the following portions of
land will be offered for Sale by Public
Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collec-
tors of Revenue, at the places and on the
days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock
at the upset price affixed to each lot re-
spectively, on the terms and conditions set
forth in certain Land Regulations, dated
June, 1843:—

At Bunbury, on Wednesday, the 9th
June next,—

Wellington Location No. 77—Comprising 10
acres more or less, 67 and 64 and location 63, the
west corner being at 2 chains S.E. from north
corner of location 67 aforesaid, and opposite bound-
aries parallel and equal. Upset price £1 per acre.

Bunbury Building Lots No. 164 and 165. Up-
set price £10 each.
