Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
*Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
 Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
 and over the Territory of Western Aus-
 tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-
 miral of the same.*

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-
 ted by a certain Act of the Imperial
 Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th
 years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled
 "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste
 Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-
 tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and
 proclaim that the following portions of
 land will be offered for Sale by Public
 Auction, by the Collector and Sub Collec-
 tors of Revenue, at the places and on the
 days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock
 at the upset price affixed to each lot re-
 spectively, on the terms and conditions set
 forth in certain Land Regulations, dated
 June, 1843:—

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
*Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
 Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
 and over the Territory of Western Aus-
 tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-
 Admiral of the same.*

WHEREAS the undermentioned Or-
 dinances were passed by the Go-
 vernor of Western Australia, with the
 advice of the Legislative Council thereof,
 in the 14th year of Her Majesty's reign,
 namely:—

No. 17—To make provision for the con-
 veyance of Mails from Port to Port within
 the limits of the colony of Western Aus-
 tralia.

No. 18—For the better apprehension of
 Offenders who shall have escaped to parts
 within the territory of Western Aus-
 tralia from any other of the Australian colo-
 nies.

No. 19—For better regulating the in-
 spection of Weights and Measures.

No. 20—For the establishment of fur-
 ther precautionary regulations for the
 Port of Fremantle.

No. 21—To limit the number of Persons
 required to act as a Grand Jury in remote
 districts of the Colony of Western Aus-
 tralia.

No. 22—To vest the site of the Convict
 Prison, at Fremantle, in certain Officers

in trust for Her Majesty, her heirs, and successors for ever.

No. 24—To prevent vexatious proceedings in certain cases of unavoidable trespass.

No. 25—To provide a more suitable mode of inflicting punishment for Drunkenness.

Now therefore I, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to allow and confirm the same respectively.
