**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843 :—

By the Sub-Collector of Revenue at the Vasse, on Wednesday, the 4th of August next :—

Sussex Location, No. 24.—Comprising (20) Twenty acres more or less, extending 14 chains 14 links east and 14 chains 14 links north from a spot 27 chains east from south-east corner of Sussex Location No. 10, opposite boundaries parallel and equal, and all bearings and boundaries true. Upset price £1 per acre.

By the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wednesday, the 4th August next,—

**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS on the 15th day of March, 1852, Proclamation was made by me, the said Governor, in the *Government Gazette* of the said colony, amongst other things, that certain provisions should be provided for each and every Passenger in every Passenger Ship proceeding from Western Australia on certain voyages, the length of which is therein computed; and whereas it is enacted by the therein recited Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 12th and 13th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating

the carriage of Passengers in Merchant Ships," that it shall also be lawful for the Governor to declare what Medicines, Medical Instruments, and other matters shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of Passengers during such colonial voyages. Now, therefore, I, Charles Fitz Gerald, Esquire, the Governor of the said colony, do hereby proclaim and declare the following Medicines, Medical Instruments, and other matters necessary for the medical treatment of Passengers, shall, from and after the date of this Proclamation, be carried by each and every Passenger Ship proceeding on the aforesaid voyages or any or either of them:—

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the following Rules and Regulations for the Customs Department at Fremantle, superseding those published in the *Government Gazette* of the 13th July inst., to be published for the information of the public.

Custom House, Fremantle,  
 July 1st, 1852.

Hours of business from 10 till 4 o'clock.  
 Clearances for ships and goods, and entries for goods in the Bonded Stores can only be passed till 3 o'clock.

Goods can be taken out of the Bonded Store till 3 o'clock.

Custom House closes on Saturdays at one o'clock.

All duties and charges paid to the Government must be in Bank Notes or Coin.

Holidays are Christmas Day, Good Friday, Queen's Accession and Birthday, and the Anniversary of the Foundation of the colony.

From 1st September to 30th April Goods will be permitted to be landed from 8 o'clock a.m., till 5 o'clock p.m., and from 1st May to 31st August from 9 a.m., till 4 p.m.

All spirits or goods for Warehousing, to be delivered at the Bonded Stores, and stowed away at the expense of the Proprietor, under the superintendence of the Government Cooper; as likewise the delivery of the same from the Warehouse; and if any spirits, or goods liable to duty, be kept on the beach

by the proprietor, and not removed to the Bonded Stores, immediately when landed, the expense of watching, after the above named hours, or carrying the same to the Bonded Stores, at the option of the officer, will be made chargeable thereon.

The Government do not hold themselves liable for any leakage, but any cask requiring cooping will be done by the Government Cooper at the expense of the proprietor.

Boatmen to deliver the Permit they receive from the officer on board, at the Custom House, or deliver it to a Custom House Officer immediately on their landing, and previous to discharging any of their cargo into flats.

Any Boatmen landing goods before the above named hours, without the presence of some Custom House Officer, will subject themselves to forfeiture of their License.
