TENDERS (in duplicate) will be re-ceived at this Office up to Noon of Wednesday, the 1st proximo, for building a five oared WHALE-BOAT for the Rottnest station, according to the under-mentioned specification :--

The Boat, when complete, to be subject to the approval of the Harbor Master, at Fremantle, from whom any further particulars can be obtained.

Length of Boat over all, 28 feet Extreme breadth, 5 feet 7 inches Depth, 2 feet 1 inch.

Keel Stem, Stern Post, and Gunwales, to be Mahogany or other suitable hard wood.

Planking of best Yellow Deal, free from knots and rents.

One Floor between every two timbers. Timbers and floors to be notched to receive the planking.

Thwarts to be dove-tailed into rising.

Mast-thwart to be double kneed.

Gunwales to be fitted with iron crutches. The Boat to have a good flat floor, not less than the usual spring of a Whale-boat and to be fastened with wrought copper nails clenched with roves throughout.

Bilge pieces to save the lands in hauling up and launching. The whole to be covered with two coats
