By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

The Boat, when complete, to be ſubject to the approval of the Harbor Maſter, at Fremantle, from whom any further particulars can be obtained.

Length of Boat over all, 28 feet
Extreme breadth, 5 feet 7 inches
Depth, 2 feet 1 inch.

Keel Stem, Stern Poſt, and Gunwales, to be Mahogany or other ſuitable hard wood.

Planking of beſt Yellow Deal, free from knots and rents.

One Floor between every two timbers.

Timbers and floors to be notched to receive the planking.

Thwarts to be dove-tailed into riſing.

Mast-thwart to be double kneed.

Gunwales to be fitted with iron crutches.

The Boat to have a good flat floor, not leſs than the uſual ſpring of a Whale-boat and to be faſtened with wrought copper nails clenched with roves throughout.

Bilge pieces to ſave the lands in hauling up and launching.

The whole to be covered with two coats of good oil paint.
