## Proclamation.

By His Excellency Charlies EinzGerald, - Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Westem Australia and its Dependencies and Fice-Admiral of the same.

I.N pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5 th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinaffer mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Laud Regulations, dated June, 1843 :-
By the Sub-Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on Wedneslay, the 5th January, 1853:-
Avoa Location No. 79-Comprising 10 acres more or less in form of an average square on right bank of the Aron next above Beverly Townsite, the eastern boundary extending 10 clains S.S.E. and the Southern boundary WSW to the river; all boundaries magnetic. Upset price $£ 1$ per acre.

PTVENDERS (in duplicate) will be received and opened at this office at 12 o'clock on Wednesday, the 29 th inst., for supplying the Local Government with such quantities of lime as may be from time to time ordered by the Superintendent of Public Works, within the townsite of Perth during a period of Six calendar months from the 1st day of Jamary 1853, to the 30th day of June next following (inclusive).

The said Lime is to be manufactured from the best Limestone, to be well burnt, and free from core and other impurities, and is to be subject upon delivery to the examination, measurement, and approval of the Superintendent of Public Works, and also to such regulations as he may determine.
