N pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843:

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS by the 2nd section of an Ordinance passed in the 12th Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "an Ordinance to provide for the establishment of a scale of Pilotage Fees and Light Dues," it is enacted among other things, that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, to establish the scale of Pilotage Fees, or dues alluded to in the 2nd section of the Act for the regulation of Pilotage and Shipping in the Harbors of Western Australia, provided that the charges in no case exceed those contained in the Schedule appended to the said first recited Ordinance: Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue of the aforesaid powers in me vested, do hereby and proclaim, that from and after the date of this my proclamation, the following charges shall be demanded and received of or from every ship or vessel frequenting the anchorages of King George's Sound; that is to say :-
