Proclamation. By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

N pursuance of the authority in me ves-Led by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, initial "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and on the days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated June, 1843 :-

At Perth, on the 2nd March 1853. Aven Location No. 104—Comprising 10 acres more or less bounded on the NE by Avon Loca-tion No. 103 of 15 ½ acres on the NW by the Avon River—on the SW by location V of G. Lloy's and a Public cemetry and vacant land—and who S'E by the new Avon read Unset price. on the SE by the new Avon road. Upset price, £1 per acre.

With a view of obviating this difficulty His Excellency the Governor having taken into consideration the peculiar circumstances of this colony and the absolute necessity of affording every facility for the detection of crime proposes laying before the Legislative Council at its next meeting a measure to enable Justices of the Peace upon any reasonable grounds of suspicion stated to them in writing under the hand of the person making such statement and whether upon oath or otherwise to issue a search warrant enabling the proper officer to search any number of houses named in such warrant by day or by night.
