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Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
and over the Territory of Western Aus-
tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Ad-
miral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me ves-
ted by a certain Act of the Imperial
Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th
years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled
"An Act for regulating the sale of Waste
Lands belonging to the crown in the Aus-
tralian Colonies," I do hereby notify and
proclaim that the following portions of
land will be offered for Sale by Public
Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collec-
tor of Revenue, at the places and on the
days hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock
at the upset price affixed to each lot re-
spectively, on the terms and conditions set
forth in certain Land Regulations, dated
June, 1843:—

At Perth on the 11th May, next:

Cockburn Sound Location No. 45—Comprising
10 acres more or less extending 10 chains West
and 10 chains North from a post in a cross trench
situate 1 chain 70 links East and 38 chains 70
links North from N.W. corner of H. Mead's
location No. 24, opposite boundaries parallel and
equal and all true. Upset price £1 per acre.

Cockburn Sound Location No. 46—Comprising
10 acres more or less in form of a square adjoining
West boundary of H. Mead's location No. 23 the
South boundary extending West from a post 6
chains 28 links North from Mundajil Brook, op-
posite boundaries parallel and equal and all true.
Upset price £1 per acre.

Cockburn Sound Location No. 47—Comprising
10 acres more or less on North bank of Medallah
Brook, the East boundary extending North
through a spot 8 chains West from West boundary
of R. Hicks' 15 acre location No. 36, and the

North boundary extending East 10 chains all
boundaries true. Upset price £1 per acre.

Swan Location No. 163—Comprising 10 acres
more or less adjoining the South boundary of J.
Logue's location No. 111 at Chittering, and ex-
tending 7 chains 22 links South from that station.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD,
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in
and over the Territory of Western Aus-
tralia and its Dependencies, and Vice-
Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority vested in
Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen
VICTORIA, by a certain Deed bearing date
the 31st day of July, 1832, and pur-
porting to be a Deed of Grant from His
late Majesty King William the 4th, to
one James Stirling, Esq., of 2,240 acres of
land, comprising the whole of Garden
Island, in the colony of Western Aus-
tralia, and which said Deed of Grant is
signed by the said James Stirling, Esq.,

then Governor of the said colony, the following portions of the said Island have been reserved for purposes of public utility and convenience:—

Block 1.—Fifteen acres more or less. Bounded on the North-East by a line about 8 chains 96 links in length, extending North 40 degrees West from Western shore of Careening Cove in Garden Island, through centre of a squared post 46 links North-West from high water margin on said shore to another squared post; on the South-West by a similar line about 10 chains 65 links in length, passing through centre of a squared post about 65 links North-West from said high water margin to a similar post; on the North-West by a straight line between North-West ends of the North-East and South-West boundaries; and on the South-East by shore of Careening Cove aforesaid, all bearings and boundaries being true or thereabouts.

Block 2.—Sixty-one acres more or less. Bounded on the North by a line about 18½ chains in length, extending West from Southern shore of Careening Cove in Garden Island, through centre of a squared post to another squared post, then by a South line about 10 chains 45 links in length to a similar post, and then by a West line about 37 chains 60 links in length to Western shore of Garden Island, passing through centre of a heap of stones 3½ feet high near said Western shore, and on the East, South, and West, by the shores of Garden Island aforesaid, all bearings and boundaries being true or thereabouts.

Block 3.—Twelve acres more or less. Bounded on the South by a line about 11 chains in length, extending West from the North-Eastern shore of Garden Island, through centre of a pile of stones 3½ feet high, about 50 links from said shore to a squared boundary post inland; on the West by a line about 9 chains in length, extending North to Northern shore of Garden Island, through centre of a similar post, about one chain south from shore last aforesaid, and on the North and East by shores of Garden Island; all bearings and boundaries being true or thereabouts.

WINE REGULATIONS.

Regulations for the issue, Duty free, of Spirits to be used for admixture with colonial Wine, and for the return of duty paid upon spirits used for such purpose, in accordance with 16th Vic. No. 3.

I.—All persons desirous of availing themselves of the privileges conferred upon proprietors and tenants of vineyards by the 3rd section of the said ordinance, to make application to the Resident Magistrate of the district, or to such other person as may be appointed for this purpose by the government, in the following form that is to say, I, _____ of _____ declare that I am _____ (proprietor, or tenant, as the case may be) of a Vineyard situate at _____ and that I have manufactured _____ Gallons of wine from grapes given therein this year; and I apply under the 16th Vic. No. 3 for _____ Gallons of spirits to be delivered to me from the Bonded store at _____ duty free, for the purpose of admixture with such wine, or, for permission to purchase _____ Gallons of spirits, from _____ to be used by me for the purpose of admixture with such wine, as the case may be, the duty paid therein signed, Dated this _____ day of _____ 185

II.—Such application, if for the issue of spirits duty free, to be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, together with a certificate from the Resident Magistrate or other proper officer that he believes the application to be a proper one, and the statement therein contained to be correct.

III.—The Colonial Secretary upon receipt of such certificate, to forward to the applicant, through the Resident Magistrate or other proper officer, an authority in the following form, that is to say:—

I hereby authorise the issue, duty free, from the Bonded store at _____ of _____ Gallons of spirits on account of _____; such spirit to be forwarded in the manner provided by the Regulations issued under the 16th Vic. No. 3, at the risk of the said _____ (to _____ Esq., the Resident Magistrate for the District of _____ or to other the proper officer appointed for this purpose, as the case may be).

IV.—Spirits to be issued duty free, as aforesaid, upon the production of the proper authority, to be gauged by the proper officer in the Bonded store (and forwarded with a letter stating the contents), in cask, with a good and a sufficient external casing properly fastened, and sealed with the proper seal, addressed to the applicant, to the care of the Resident Magistrate, or other proper officer, who shall see that the seals

are unbroken, and that the casing is unopened, and who shall also see the spirit mixed with such colonial wine, and who shall also forward to the Colonial Secretary a certificate to this effect, in the following form:

I certify, that I have received in good order from the Bonded Store at _____ on account of _____ a cask, with case properly sealed, said to contain _____ gallons of spirits, for admixture with colonial wine the property of _____ and I further certify, that I have seen all the same spirits mixed with _____ gallons of colonial wine manufactured by the said _____ in 185

V.—If the application be for permission to purchase spirits with a view of obtaining repayment of duty, the Resident Magistrate or other proper officer if satisfied with the propriety of such application, and with the correctness of the statement therein contained, to whom the application is made, is to see the spirits drawn off from cask, and to retain the same in his custody until mixed in his presence with the colonial wine and thereupon he is to forward to the Colonial Secretary a certificate to the effect in the following form:

I hereby certify that I have seen _____ gallons of spirits purchased and drawn from the cask by _____ from _____ of _____ and that the same has remained in my custody until mixed by me with _____ gallons of colonial wine manufactured by _____ in 185

VI.—The Colonial Secretary upon receipt of such last mentioned certificate to obtain the usual authority to the colonial Treasurer for the repayment of the amount of duty paid upon the spirits so used and to forward the same to the person entitled to receive the same.

VII.—Officers superintending the admixture of spirits with colonial wine, under these regulations, to be entitled to claim, and be paid in advance, 10s for each occasion upon which they may be called upon to act, together with mileage at the rate of 1s for each mile they may be obliged to travel, and, if occupied more than 12 hours, to be entitled to claim, and be paid in like manner, 10s for each additional 12 hours during which they may be so occupied.

VIII.—No person is entitled to receive spirit duty free for admixture, or to refund the duty upon spirits mixed, with less, in the whole than 100 gallons of wine, or to any greater extent than 4 gallons of spirit to every 100 gallons of wine.
