THÉREAS by a Proclamation dated W the sixth day of January instant, issued under my hand and the Public Seal of the said colony it was notified that a session of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the said colony

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should be held at the Court House at Perth in the said colony on Thursday, the 19th January instant; and whereas an application has been made to me on behalf of certain prisoners recently committed for trial at the said Sessions to rescind the said Proclamation and to appoint the said Ses-sions to be held at a further time; and which said Proclamation is hereby rescinded accordingly; Now therefore in pursuance and in exercise of the powers and authorities in that behalf vested in me, I do hereby notify and proclaim that a Sessions of the Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace in and for the said colony, will be held at the Court House at Perth, in the said colony, on Thursday the 26th day of January inst., at nine o'clock in the forenoon.
