Keel, Stem, Sternpost and Gunwales to be mahogany.

Planking—best yellow deal or Singapore cedar, clear of knots and rents

Timbers and Floors to be notched to receive planking. One floor between every two timbers.

Thwarts to be dove-tailed into rising. Mast thwarts to be double kneed.

Gunwales to be fitted with Iron Crutches instead of tholepins, and with Tack and Sheet Hooks.

The Boat to have a good flat floor not less than the usual spring of a Whale-boat, and to be fastened with wrought copper nails and fastenings throughout. Bilge pieces to save the lands in hauling up and launching the boat. The whole to be covered with two coats of Paint and finished in one month.
