N pursuance of the authority in me vest ted by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portion of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue at the places and days hereinafter mentioned at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Rei gulations, dated June, 1843:-
