**Proclamation.**

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD  
Esquire, Commander in the Royal Navy,  
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in  
and over the territory of Western Australia  
and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral  
of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portions of land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue, at the places and days hereinafter mentioned at 1<sup>o</sup> o'clock, at the upset price affixed to each lot respectively, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:

**T**HE Registrar General directs the attention of the Public to the following penalties imposed under Colonial Ordinances for the non-registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages; and as great inconvenience, in a Statistical point of view, is occasioned by the omission of parties to register; the district Registrars are requested to prosecute in all cases of wilful neglect which may come to their knowledge.

4 & 5 Victoria No. 10, sec. 6, enacts.—“That the Father or Mother of any child born, or the occupier of every house or tenement in which any birth or death shall happen, shall *within one month* after the date of such birth or death respectively give notice to the Sub-Registrar of the District.” And Section 13 of the same Act enacts “That if the Father or Mother of any child born or the occupier of any house or tenement in which any birth or death shall happen shall fail to give notice as aforesaid of such birth or death *within the space of one calendar month* from the time of such birth or death, he or she shall forfeit and pay a sum of *not less than twenty shillings and not more than Five Pounds.*”

12th Victoria No. 11 Sec. 4 imposes a penalty not exceeding £50 on any Minister or Priest, not being of the Church of England, who shall neglect to transmit within one Calendar Month after the solemnization of Matrimony a duplicate of the declaration and certificate of marriage required by the 1st and 2nd sec. of the said Act to the registrar of the district.

12th Vic. No 13. sect 4 imposes a similar penalty on every Minister of the Church of England who shall neglect to forward to the District Registrar within the same time a duplicate certificate of the marriage respectively solemnized by them
