By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esquire, Comma der in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Aus-tralia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

N parsuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portions of Land will be offered for sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue and ub-Collectors of Revenue, at the places hereinafter mentioned, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:-
