tralia and its Dependencies, and Vice-
Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me
 vested by a certain Act of the Impe-
 rial Parliament of Great Britain and Ire-
 land, passed in the 5th and 6th years of
 Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act
 for regulating the sale of Waste Lands
 belonging to the Crown in the Australian
 Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim,
