Timbers and Floors to be notched to re. ceive planking.

Thwarts to be dovetailed into rising. Mast Thwart to be double-kneed.

Gunwales to be fitted with Iron Crut. ches, tack and sheet hooks and cleets.

Keel to be 3 inches deep clear, of Gara bard strakes.
