A Bill to amend 16th Vict. No. 4, commonly called the Branding Act.

2.

A Bill to regulate and extend the payment of Pilotage, and to establish under proper restrictions, that of Harbor Dues.

3.

A Bill for the more speedy trial and punishment of Offences in case of Larceny under £5.

4.

A Bill to regulate the Forms to be observed by Conditional Pardon Men prior to their leaving the colony.

5.

A Bill to amend the Law relative to the Registration of Deeds, Wills, Judgments, and conveyances affecting real property.

6.

A Bill for the further regulation of Practitioners in the Civil Court.

7.

A Bill to amend the 4th and 5th Vict. No. 8, Clause 34.

8.

A Bill to abolish Grand Juries, and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof.

9.

A Bill to provide for the encouragement, safe custody, and increase of Small Savings belonging to the industrious classes in Western Australia.

10.

A Bill to extend the power of arrest on Mesne Process in Civil Actions, for extending the remedies of Creditors against Debtors, and for amending the Laws relative to Insolvent Debtors not in custody.

11.

A Bill for the abolition of unnecessary Oaths and to substitute Declarations in lieu thereof.

12.

A Bill for the adoption of two Acts of the Imperial Parliament for the amendment of the law with respect to Wills and relating to the law of Evidence respectively.

13.

Private Bill—A Bill to enable certain denominations of Christians, called the Congregational Church in the colony of Western Australia, to hold lands to raise a sum or sums of money on the security of such lands and for other purposes therein mentioned.
