Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of land will be offered for sale by Public Auction, by the Collector of Revenue at Perth on the 2nd day of May, 1855, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:—

Perth Building Lot Y 99. Upset price £25.

Fremantle suburban lot No 24, containing four acres. Upset price 4*l.* per acre.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the territory of Western Australia and its dependencies and Vice-

Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by clause of the 4th Chapter of a certain order in Council by Her Majesty Queen Victoria, bearing date the 22nd day of March, 1850, and promulgated in this colony on the 9th of September, 1851, it is made "competent for the Governor of the said colony, with the advice of his Executive Council at any time within three months after the determination of any pastoral lease, and notwithstanding any right of renewal thereof, to declare by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, that all or any of the lands comprised in such lease which may be within one mile of any lands which have been granted in fee by the Crown, shall thereafter be deemed to be within class A." And Whereas Pastoral Lease, No 492, containing 2000 acres of land on left bank of the river Pallinup, has recently ceased and determined. I, do hereby notify and proclaim, with the advice aforesaid, that the following portion of the said Lease will henceforth be deemed to be within class A, and will be subject to all the rules and regulations applicable thereto:—namely, all that land on the left bank of the river Pallinup, bounded on N.W. by a N.E. line from said river at 80 chains N.W. from North corner of G. Cheyne's location No 69, on the S.E. by a similar line at 62 chains S.E. from North corner aforesaid, and on the N.E. by a S.E. line of 142 chains at 80 chains N.E. from said North corner, all bearings true.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the first section of an Ordinance to provide for the Establishment of proper places for the burial of the dead, passed the 12th day of August, 1847, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council from time to time to appoint by Proclamation such place or places in each district as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the burial of the Dead; now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council do by this my Proclamation, appoint the undermentioned places as Reserves for Public Cemeteries in the following towns respectively, but subject always to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same, that is to say:—

York Allotment No. 13 for Church of England and Ireland.

Ditto No. 15 for Wesleyans

Ditto " 16 Roman Catholics

Ditto " 40 Independents

Albany Allotment No. 329, Roman Catholics.

Road between York and Beverley.

A PUBLIC ROAD, sixty-six feet in width, between York and Beverley Townsites, off the Eastern bank of the River Avon, having been laid out, cleared, and opened for general traffic, the same is hereby published and declared to be a public line of communication according to the undermentioned description and limits, in terms of the Local Ordinance 12 Victoria No. 23.

The road aforesaid is on the eastern side of the following lines, which are described with reference to the true meridian, and are marked at their respective angles of meeting by stout posts, squared, and pointed at top, and placed in trenches by the roadside.

Commencing at a boundary mark at S.E.
