Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy,
Governor and Commander-in-Chief in
and over the Territory of Western Aus-
tralia and its Dependencies, and Vice-
Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me
vested by a certain Act of the Im-
perial Parliament of Great Britain and
Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years
of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An
Act for regulating the sale of Waste
Lands belonging to the Crown in the
Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify
and proclaim, that the following portion

Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS it is necessary for the effectual administration of the Ordinance 18th Victoria, No 10, for the purposes of the said Ordinance that the several Ports and Harbors of Western Australia should be defined by prescribed limits, to be published in the *Government Gazette* of the said colony, under the authority of the Governor thereof; now therefore I the said Governor do hereby declare and proclaim that for the purposes aforesaid the several Ports and Harbors of Western Australia shall be deemed and taken to be limited as follows, that is to say:—

The Port of *Fremantle* shall include the waters bounded on the West by a line between west end of Rottnest Island and Cape Peron, on the North by a line from north end of Rottnest Island to the winding sheet north of Fremantle, and on the East and South by the coast line of the main land.

The Port of *Bunbury* shall extend from Point Casurina, to a part of the sea coast one league north of the mouth of the Leschenault Inlet.

The Port of *Vasse* shall extend one league each way east and west of the Tub Beacon at Busselton, and three miles to the seaward.

The Port of *Albany* shall include the waters lying west of a line between the extreme Point of Bald Head on the South

and Bat Point on the north.

The Port of *Champion Bay* shall extend from Point Moore on the South, to the mouth of Chapman River on the North.

Port Gregory shall include all the water lying within the rocky ledges which form the Port.

Geographe Bay shall include all the waters lying south of a line from the extremity of Cape Naturaliste, to the Tub Beacon at Busselton.

Flinders Bay or *Port Augusta* shall include all the space lying to the west of a line from the southernmost dry rock of the Alonam Isles, to a spot one league eastward from the mouth of Hardey's Inlet.
