Proclamation. LIMITS OF THE PORT OF FRE-MANTLE EXTENDED.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commandersin-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice.

Admiral of the same.

HEREAS by the Customs Ordinance No. 16 of the 17th Victoria, boundaries were assigned to several Ports in Western Australia, and authority was given to the Governor to alter or vary the same from time to time by Proclamation, in the Government Gazette; now therefore, I, the said Governor, do hereby declare and publish that for the purposes of the above recited ordinance, the Port of Fremantle shall henceforth be deemeed to be limited as follows, that is to say-bounded on the North by a straight line from the north end of Rottnest Island to the wind. ing sheet north of Fremantle, on the West by a line from the west end of Rottnest to west end of Garden Islands, and thence to the outward rock called the Sisters, at south end of "Warnbro" Sound, on the South by a shoal spit between the Sisters and Point Becher, and on the East by the shore of the main land between Point Becher and the winding sheet aforesaid.

# Proclamation. RESUMPTION OF LAND ON THE WILLIAMS RIVER.

By His Excellency Charles FitzGerald, Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Wes ern Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-

Admiral of the same.

N pursuance of authority vested in Her Most Gracious Maiesty Queen Via Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, I, Charles FitzGerald. Esquire, Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, acting for and on behalf of her said Majesty, do hereby proclaim, that, having awarded full and satisfactory compensation, therefore I have this day resumed for purposes of public utility and convenience, the land hereunder described, that is to say - twenty acres more or less forming part of the Williams River location Q and bounded on the West by a hridge across the River Williams about 13 chains below the mouth of MacDermott's Brook, then by a line of about 96 links extending South 111 deg. West from south corner pile of said bridge then by a line of about  $6\frac{1}{2}$  chains extending South 20 deg. East, and then by a line of about 5 chains extending South 29 deg. East, on the South by an east line of about  $12\frac{1}{2}$  chains, on the East by a north line of about 14 chains crossing MacDermott's Brook aforesaid, and on the North by a line of about 5 chains 95 links extending West to Williams River aforesaid, through centre of a stout squared post 95 links east from middle of the River's bed, and then by said River downwards to the bridge hereinbefore first mentioned, all bearings and boundaries being true or thereabouts, and a stout squared post being placed at all corners of the land above described.
