HIS Excellency the Governor directs
 the publication for general infor-
 mation of the following Rules and Regula-
 tions for the management of Small Savings
 Deposit.

Rules and Regulations for the management of Small Savings Deposits.

1.—On and after the 22nd June next,
 the Colonial Treasurer will be prepared to
 receive Deposits from Persons desirous of
 availing of the benefit accorded by the
 Ordinance 18th Victoria, No. 3, for the
 safe custody and increase of small savings.

2.—Deposits of not less than One Pound
 nor more than Twenty-five Pounds, will
 be received from any one person during
 each year (exclusive of Interest), but De-
 posits will not be received from any Depo-
 sitor after he or she shall have to his or
 her credit a sum of £100.

3.—Interest at the rate of Five Pounds
 per Centum per Annum will be allowed
 upon the amount of such Deposits as may
 remain in the hands of the Treasurer for
 three months, such period always dating
 from the 1st day of the regular quarter of

the year. No interest will be allowed on
 the fractional part of a Pound, nor on any
 amount for the broken part of a quarter.

4.—So often as the Treasurer shall re-
 ceive a Deposit he shall give to the Depo-
 sitor a receipt in the form annexed, and a
 counterpart of such receipt shall be entered
 by the Treasurer in a Book to be kept by
 him for that purpose. The Treasurer shall
 also issue on demand a similar receipt for
 the amount of any Interest that may be
 added to Principal.

5.—A Depositor may withdraw the
 whole or any part of his or her Deposit,
 by Draft in the form hereto annexed. The
 signature of the drawer is to be attested by
 a Justice of the Peace, but no such draft
 shall be for a less sum than One Pound
 when the drawer shall have that amount
 to his or her credit.

6.—When a Deposit shall have been
 made by a Minor, or by any person for the
 benefit of a Minor, the Treasurer shall pay
 the amount of such deposit upon the
 draft of such minor only, and the Trea-
 surer shall in like manner pay any
 amount deposited by a married wo-
 man to such woman, unless her husband
 give written notice of such marriage, and
 require payment to be made to him.

7.—In the event of the death of any
 Depositor, the Treasurer shall hand over
 the amount of his or her Deposit to his or
 her Executor or Assigns, or in default of
 any such to the Public Administrator,
 whose receipt, in either case, shall be a
 sufficient discharge.

8.—Within five days after the end of
 each Quarter the Treasurer shall cause to
 be made out an account shewing the
 amount of Interest that has accrued upon
 each persons Deposit, and should the De-
 positor not demand such Interest within
 two weeks after the Quarter Day, such
 Interest shall then be added to the Prin-
 cipal, and bear Interest at the same rate
 as a Deposit from the 1st day of the
 Quarter.

9.—The Treasurer shall keep separate
 and distinct accounts of the "Small Sav-
 ings Deposits," and shall open such
 books for the correct keeping of the ac-
 counts as may from time to time be deemed
 requisite by the Auditor General, who
 shall at all times be at liberty to inspect
 such books.

10.—Before the 31st January in each
 year the Treasurer shall forward to the
 Colonial Secretary a full, true, and just
 account of the amount of Deposits received
 during the previous year and the Interest
 that has accrued thereon, but it shall not
 be necessary to insert in such account the
 names of the Depositors.

11.—A copy of these Rules is to be
 kept suspended in some conspicuous part
 of the Treasurer's Office.
