THE following Address has been presented to His Excellency the Governor by the Right Rev. Dr Serra, Roman Catholic Bishop at Perth :-

To His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Governor and Commander-iu-Ohief of Western Australia, &c., &c.

May it please your Excellency,-

At the eve of your departure from this colony, I have a duty to perform ; a duty that I fulfil most sincerely in my own name, in the name of my Clergy, and in the name of the Catholic population of W.A. I did not entertain any doubt about the duty itself, though I have been wavering about the manner of performing it. To express our feelings to your Excellency with the rest of the Community, it would not have shown our feelings as Catholics; to express them as a separate body, I was afraid it could have led some one to believe that Governor FitzGerald had paid more regard to the rights of the Catholics of W.A., than strict justice required-However considering that your Excellency righteously minded in religious rights, as well as in all other branches of administration, has de. sired always to do justice to the Catholics; I feel it my duty in this melancholy moment of your departure from the colony, to present our most sincere thanks to your Excellency, and our most earnest wishes for the prosperity and happiness of Mrs. FitzGerald, of your Excellency, and of your lovely family. Whatever will in future be the destiny, that Providence will assign to your Excellency; there will invariably accompany you these feelings, which are the feelings of the Catholic population of W. A., the feelings of my own Clergy, and of
