Proclamation.

By His Excellency CHARLES FITZGERALD, Esq., Commander in the Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portion of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction by the Collector of Revenue, at Perth, on the 1st day of August next, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843 :

Intended Road Northam to Bolgart

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,
July 12, 1855.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the publication for the information of all whom it may concern, of the following general description of an intended public road to be run between Northam Townsite and Bolgart Reserve, as nearly as may be found desirable along the line at present in use.

The road to be sixty-six feet wide, commencing at the turning off from the present marked road adjoining the new Churchsite at Northam, and extending in a NN Westerly direction crossing the Nor-

thern boundary of Northern Townsite about 35½ chains from its east end, crossing the Northern boundary of location R about 40½ chains from its East end, crossing the Northern boundary of Location E nearly 36 chains from its east end, entering the Southern boundary of Location W about 85½ chains from its West end, crossing the Western boundary of the same Location about 88 chains from the West corner of the Location, and extending thence in a general NNW direction for 11½ miles to Bejoording, passing through the Eastern part of Location No 4. From Bejoording the Road will pass in a Northerly direction to Bolgart Spring, crossing obliquely through portions of Locations 5 and 37, and thence will take a NN Westerly direction towards Moore River and Champion Bay.
