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**Proclamation.**

*By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

IN pursuance of the authority in me vested by a certain Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 5th and 6th years of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim, that the following portions of Land will be offered for sale by public auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collectors of Revenue at the following places and times, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1843:—

*By the Collector of Revenue at Perth, on the 5th day of September:—*

Perth Building Lot Y 5. Upset price £15.

Cockburn Sound Location No. 71.—Comprising 10 acres more or less, extending 10 chains West, and 10 chains South from a spot about 22 chains west, from another spot 1 chain 8 links South, from NW corner of location 44 to W. Hymus'; opposite boundaries parallel and equal and all true. Upset price £1 per acre.

Guildford and Upper Swan—Weekly.  
Perth and Canning—Weekly,  
Perth and Albany—Once a Month.

This last Tender must include the Conveyance of all Steamers' and other Ships' Mails to and from the Sound.

Tenders must state the rate per mile at which the Contractor will undertake to convey additional or Express Mails, the mode in which it is intended to convey the mail, whether on horseback or in a spring cart, and the probable time he will take in conveying it to its destination.

The arrivals and departures of Mails will be subject to instructions from the General Post Office, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved Sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a Bond for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payments will be made on account of any Mail Contract until such Bond shall have been respectively signed by the Contractor and his Sureties, and any breach of Contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of Mails at the appointed days and hours, will subject the Contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his month's pay.
