CONVEYANCE OF MAILS.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,
August 15, 1855.

TENDERS (in duplicate), will be received at this office up to noon of Wednesday the 21st November next, for the Conveyance of Mails throughout the Colony, from the 1st January, to the 31st December, 1856, inclusive.

The Tender may embrace the whole or any portion of the undermentioned lines:—

Perth & Fremantle—Twice a day,

Fremantle and Bunbury, *via* Mandurah and Australind—Weekly,
Bunbury and Vasse—Weekly,
Perth and Guildford—Daily,
Guildford and Northam—Weekly,
Northam and York—Weekly,
Northam and Toodyay—Weekly,
Guildford and Upper Swan—Weekly.
Perth and Canning—Weekly,
Perth and Albany—Once a Month.

This last Tender must include the Conveyance of all Steamers' and other Ships' Mails to and from the Sound.

Tenders must state the rate per mile at which the Contractor will undertake to convey additional or Express Mails, the mode in which it is intended to convey the mail, whether on horseback or in a spring cart, and the probable time he will take in conveying it to its destination.

The arrivals and departures of Mails will be subject to instructions from the General Post Office, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved Sureties will be required to join the Contractor in a Bond for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payments will be made on account of any Mail Contract until such Bond shall have been respectively signed by the Contractor and his Sureties, and any breach of Contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of Mails at the appointed days and hours, will subject the Contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his month's pay.

Tenders to be inscribed "Tenders for Conveyance of Mails," and each Tender to have the signatures of the proposed Sureties.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, ESQUIRE, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland, passed in the 15th and 16th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws relating to the Carriage of Passengers by Sea," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of any of Her Majesty's Possessions abroad, by any Proclamation to be by him from time to time issued for that purpose (which shall take effect from the issuing thereof), to declare what shall be deemed necessary for the purposes of this Act, to be the length of the Voyage of any Ship carrying Passengers from such Possessions to any other place whatsoever, and to substitute for the articles of food and provisions specified in this Act, such other articles of food and provisions as he shall deem to be a full equivalent for the same; and also to declare what Medicines, Medical Instruments, and other Matters, shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the Passengers, during such Colonial Voyage. Now, therefore, I, Arthur Edward Kennedy, the Governor aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, issued for that purpose, do declare that the following shall be the rule of computation by which the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from Western Australia to the several places hereinafter enumerated shall be computed, for the purposes of the said recited Act; that is to say:—

And I do further declare that in addition to, and irrespective of any provisions of their own which any Passenger may have on board, the Master of every such

ship shall make to each Passenger during the voyage, including the time of detention, if any, at any port or place before the termination of such voyage the following issues of pure water, and sweet and wholesome provisions, (that is to say) of sweet and wholesome water, at least three quarts daily, and of provisions after the rate per week of two and a half pounds of bread or biscuit, not inferior in quality to what is usually called Navy Biscuit, one pound of Wheaten Flour, five pounds of Oatmeal, two pounds of Rice, two ounces and a half of Tea, one pound of Sugar. Provided always that such provisions shall be made in advance, and not less than twice in a week, the first of such issues to be made on the day of embarkation; provided also that twenty-five pounds of sound Potatoes may be substituted for the five pounds of Oatmeal; or Wheaten Bread or Flour may be substituted for the Rice and Oatmeal, weight for weight. And I do hereby further declare that the Medicines, Medical Instruments, and other matters necessary for the Medical treatment of the Passengers during any such voyage, shall be as follows; namely—
