## Proclamation.

By Wis Excellency Arthur Edwamd Enmedey, Esquire, Govemor and Com-mander,in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependen. cies, and Fice-Admiral of the same.
THHEREAS by un Act of the Imperial Parliament of Great Britain and Treland, passed in the 15th and 16th years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Laws relating to the Carriage of Passengers by Sea," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of any of Her Mijesty's Possessions abroad, by any Proclamation to be by him from time to time issued fur that purpose (which shall take effect from the issuing thereot), to declare what shall be deemed necessary for the purposes of this Act, to be the length of the Voyage of any Ship carrying Passengers from such Possessions to any other place whatsoever, and to substitute for the articles of food and provisions specified in this Act, such other articles of food and provisions as he shall deem to be a full equivalent for the same; and also to deelare what Medicines, Med cal Instrumonts, nud other Matters, shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the Passengers, during such Colonial Voyage. Now, therefore, J, Arthme Edward Kennedy, the Governor aforesaid, by this my Proclamation, issued for that purpose, do dechare that the following shall be the rule of computation by which the length of the voyage of any ship carrying Passengers from Western Australia to the several places hereinafter enumerated shall be computed, for the purposes of the said recited Act; that is to say:-

And I do further declare that in addition to, and irrespective of any provisions of their own which any Passenger may hare on board, the Master of ever? such
thip shall make to each Passen ；er during the voyage，including the time of deten－ tion，if any，at any port or place before the termination of such voyage the follow－ ing issues of puro water，and sweet and wholesome provisions，（that is to gay）of sweet and wholesome water，at least three quar紋daly，and of provisions after the rate per week of two and a halt pounds of bread or biscuit，not inferior in quality to what is usually called Navy Biscuit，one pound of Wheaten Flour，five pounds of Oatmeal，two pounds of Rice，two ounces and a half of Tea，one pound of Sugar． Provided always that such provisione shall be made in advance，and nor less than twice in a week，the first of such issues to be made on the day of embarkation ；pro－ vided aiso that twenty－five pounds of sound Potatoes may be substituted for the five pounds of Oatmeal；or Wheaten Bread or Flour may be substitated for the Rice and Oatmeal，weight for weight．And I do hereby further declare that the Medicines， Medical Instruments，and other matters mecessary for the Medical treatment of the Passengers during any such royage，shall be as follows；namely－
