Perth & Fremantle-Twice a day, Fremantle and Bunbury, via Mandurah

and Australind—Weekly, Bunbury and Vasse—Weekly, Perth and Guildford—Daily, Guildford and Northam—Weekly, Northam and York—Weekly, Northam and Toodyay—Weekly, Guildford and Upper Swan—Weekly. Perth and Canning—Weekly.

Perth and Albany-Once a Month. This last Tender must include the

Conveyance of all Steamers' and other Ships' Mails to and from the Sound.

Tenders must state the rate per mile at which the Contractor will undertake to convey additional or Express Mails, the mode in which it is intended to convey the mail, whether on horseback or in a spring cart, and the probable time he will take in conveying it to its destination.

The arrivals and departures of Mails will be subject to instructions from the General Post Office, and liable to alteration at any time during the year. Two approved Sureties will be required

to join the Contractor in a Bond for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payments will be made on account of any Mail Contract until such Bond shall have been respectively signed by the Contractor and his Sureties, and any breach of Contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of Mails at the ap. pointed days and hours, will subject the Contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his month's pay.

Tenders to be inscribed "Tenders for Conveyance of Mails," and each Tender to have the signatures of the proposed Sureties.

#### Road between York and Northam. Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, September 15, 1855.

Public Road, sixty-six feet in width. having been laid out and partially cleared between York and the vicinity of Northam, the same is hereby published and declared to be a public line of communication according to the undermentioned description, and limits, in terms of the Local Ordinance, 12 Vic., No. 23.

The road referred to is on the Western side of the following lines, which are described with reference to the magnetic meridian, and are marked at their respective angles of meeting by stout posts. squared, pointed at top, and placed in trenches by the road side.
