PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, ESQUIRE, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Local Legislature, intituled "An Act to constitute the Island of Rottnest a Legal Prison," it is among other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, or officer administering the Government of the colony with the advice and consent of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time by Proclamation, to make all such precautionary rules and regulations touching the places, and times and manner of landing of boats at the said Island, as may be thought necessary for the due custody and prevention of the escape of the Prisoners. Now therefore, I, the Governor, by Virtue and in exercise of the authority conferred upon me by the said recited Act, and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby order and direct that from and after the date hereof the following Rules and Regulations shall be observed by all person visiting the Island of Rottnest:—

1st.—That any person wishing to proceed to the Island of Rottnest shall first obtain a written permission to do so from the Colonial Secretary.

2nd.—That no such permission shall entitle any person to land on the Island before sunrise or after sunset.

3rd.—That all boats shall land in the bay called Thompson's Bay, on the North East side of the Island, which has been fixed upon as the landing place.

4th.—That on landing, individuals shall report themselves to the Superintendent, producing their written permission to visit the Island.

5th.—That no communication shall be allowed with the prisoners, nor shall the buildings or places set apart for their confinement, or employment be allowed to be visited unless in the presence of the Superintendent.

6th.—That no person shall be allowed to pass the night on the Island without the permission of the Superintendent, who is empowered to order any one off the Island if he may deem it expedient.

7th.—That no boat shall on any account, be permitted to enter into any of the bays of the Island or to approach the rocks adjacent for the purpose of fishing or otherwise, without a written permission to do so, under the hand of the Colonial Secretary.

8th.—That the rules regulating the landing of persons on Rottnest, are not intended to apply to the case of parties compelled from shipwreck or stress of weather to take refuge on the Island.

9th.—That any wilful violation of the above rules, shall render the parties liable

to the penalties enumerated in the second clause of the Act.

NOTICE is hereby given for the information of the public that, from and after this date, printed Books, Magazines, Reviews, and Pamphlets, (whether British, Colonial, or Foreign) may be transmitted by the post between the sea port towns of this colony, (Perth included) and South Australia, either by sailing vessels or contract packets, at the following rates of postage, viz. :—

For each packet not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. in weight, (6d) six pence.

For each packet exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. and not not exceeding 1 lb (1s) one shilling.

For each packet exceeding 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs. (2s) two shillings.

For each packet exceeding 2 lbs. and not exceeding 3 lbs. (3s) three shillings, beyond which weight no packet can be sent.

Provided however, that the following conditions be carefully observed :—

1. Every such packet must be sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the ends or sides.

2. It must contain a single volume (whether printed Book, Magazine, Review or Pamphlet) several sheets or parts thereof when there are more than one being sewn or bound together.

3. It must not exceed 2 feet in length, breadth, width, or depth.

4. It must not exceed 3 lbs. in weight.

5. It must have no writing or marks upon the cover or its contents, except the name and address of the person to whom it may be sent.

6. The postage must be prepaid in full by affixing outside the packet or its cover the proper number of stamps.

The packet will be delivered at the Sea Ports of South Australia (Adelaide included) without further charge but if any of the foregoing conditions be violated the packet will be charged as a letter.

Packets arriving at any of the ports of the colony for persons in Inland Towns (Perth excepted) must be conveyed to their respective destinations at the expense of the owners thereof, to whom due notice will be given from this Office of such arrival.

Any alterations which a lessee may require in the boundaries or quantity of land in an 8 years pastoral lease, will, if approved, be granted only on payment of a fine of £5 for a new lease. Such fine must be paid at the time of sending in the application to the Colonial Secretary, and will be charged once only.

The old lease must also be delivered up for cancellation previous to a new one being issued from the Revenue Office.

A new or amended lease will expire on the same date as that which it may be intended to supersede.

Parties claiming class A licenses in right of being the occupants or owners of adjoining fee simple lands, must in their applications refer distinctly to the lands in right of which they found their claims.

No class A license will be issued, either for the whole or any portion of the year, for a less sum than £1.

Applications for leases or licenses, or for any alterations therein, and all correspondence connected therewith, must be addressed to the Colonial Secretary.

REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations made by the Victoria Steam Navigation Board.

COLONY OF VICTORIA.

Regulations respecting the Lights to be exhibited by Steam and Sailing Vessels and Signals to be made during thick and foggy weather.

The Victoria Steam Navigation Board, in compliance with Section 29 of the "Victoria Steam Navigation Act," and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have determined that from and after the first day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five, the following Regulations shall be strictly observed on board all Steam and Sailing vessels coming within the provisions of the said Act of the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Council, 16 Victoria, No. 25.

SEA-GOING STEAM VESSELS.

All sea-going steam vessels, whether propelled by paddles or screw, shall, within all seas, gulfs, channels, straits, bays, creeks, roads, roadsteads, harbours, havens, ports or rivers within the Colony of Victoria, and under all circumstances, between sunset and sunrise, exhibit lights of such description and in such manner as is hereinafter mentioned, viz:

When under Steam.

- A bright white light at foremast head
- A green light on the starboard side
- A red light on the port side.

Mast Head Light.

1st. The mast-head light is to be visible at a distance of at least five (5) miles in a dark night, with a clear atmosphere; and the lantern is to be so constructed as to show a uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of twenty points of the compass, being ten points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side.

Starboard Bow Light.

2nd. The green light on the starboard side is to be visible at a distance of at least two (2) miles in a dark night, with a clear atmosphere; and the lantern is to be so constructed as to show a uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of ten points of the compass, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side.

Port Bow Light.

3rd. The red light on the Port side is likewise to be fitted so as to throw its light the same distance on that side.

4th. The side lights are moreover to be fitted with screens, on the inboard side, of at least three feet long, to prevent the lights from being seen across the bow.

At Anchor.

When at anchor—A common bright light.

RIVER STEAM VESSELS.

Mast-head Light, Bowsprit Light.

River steam vessels, while steaming under weigh between sunset and sunrise, shall exhibit two lights, viz.:—One bright plain light at the foremast head, to be visible all around the horizon at a distance of at least two miles in a clear dark night, and one deep red light hung outside the stem, under the bowsprit.

Height of Mast.

River steam vessels plying without mast shall exhibit the upper light from a pole, to be placed amidships before the paddle boxes, the light not to be less than twelve feet from the deck.

Light at Anchor.

When at anchor—A common bright light, visible all round the horizon.

FOG-SIGNALS FOR STEAM VESSELS.

Bell and Steam Whistle.

The master of any steam vessel while steaming under weigh during thick or foggy weather shall, in addition to the lights already provided to be carried, cause a bell to be rung or a steam whistle to be sounded every minute, and whenever a steam vessel while under weigh shall be within any harbour or river within the colony of Victoria between the hours of sunset and sunrise, he shall cause the above signals to be made by ringing the bell or sounding the whistle, and shall continue the same until the vessel shall have arrived at her wharf or anchorage.

LIGHTS FOR SAILING VESSELS.

When under Sail.

The Victoria Steam Navigation Board also hereby require that all sailing vessels, when under sail or being towed, approaching or being approached by any other vessel, shall be bound to show between sunset and sunrise, a constant bright light in such a position as can be best seen by such vessel or vessels, and in sufficient time to avoid collision.

At Anchor.

All sailing vessels at anchor in roadsteads or fairways shall also be bound to exhibit, between sunset and sunrise, a constant bright light at the mast head, except within harbours or other places where regulations for other lights for vessels are legally established. The lantern to be used when at anchor, by steam vessels and sailing vessels, is to be so constructed as to show a clear good light all around the horizon. The Board also direct that the 30th section of the Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council, 16 Victoria, No 25, having reference to vessels passing each other, be published for general information.

Vessels passing each other.

"Whenever any vessel proceeding in one direction meets a vessel proceeding in another direction, and the master or other person having charge of either such vessel perceives that if both vessels

"continue their respective courses they
 "will pass so near as to involve any risk
 "of a collision, he shall put the helm of
 "his vessel to port so as to pass on the
 "port side of the other vessel, due regard
 "being had to the tide and to the position
 "of each vessel with respect to the
 "dangers of the channel, and as regards
 "sailing vessels to the keeping of each
 "vessel under command; and the master
 "of any steam vessel navigating any river
 "or narrow channel shall keep as far as
 "practicable to that side of the fairway or
 "midchannel thereof which lies on the
 "starboard side of such vessel; and if the
 "master or other person having charge of
 "any steam vessel neglect to observe these
 "regulations or either of them, he shall for
 "every such offence be liable to a penalty
 "not exceeding fifty pounds."

The regulations framed by the Board on
 this subject, are dated the 14th day of
 June, 1853, are hereby revoked.
