Downing Street, May 1, 1855. SIR,-I have received your Despatch No. 135, of 15th December, forwarding a memorial from a number of Merchants and other Residents in Fremantle, who pray for the removal of the Seat of Government to that City, toge-ther with some Resolutions passed at a Public Meeting at Guildford, representing amongst other things the superior advantages of that town, in case the Seat of Government should be removed from Perth.

You will inform the memorialists that their representations have reached me, but that I do not find in them sufficient grounds to induce me to entertain a proposition for the removal of the Scat of Government, which removal would entail much inconvenience and expense to the Colony without an adequate prospect of countervailing advantage to the general body of the Inhabitants.
