# Important to Mariners. Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, May 16, 1856.

THE following report on Pollock Reef, is published for general information. By His Excellency's command, FRED. P. BARLEE,

Colonial Secretary. POLLOCK REEF.

The above dangerous reef was seen by

me whilst on a voyage from Adelaide to Swan River in the brigantine "Robert Clive" on 21st April, 1856, and by fa. vourable observations was found to lie 14 miles in direction South half East (mag. netic) from the nearest part of the South East Isles of the Recherche Archipelago.

This position on Flinder's Chart will be in lat., 34° 35' South; longitude, 123° 281' East.

Passing 31 miles Southward of the Reef at 101 hours a.m., the weather being fine, and a long swell rolling in from the S.W., the shoal water was observed from aloft to extend about one mile in an East and West direction, and to be 200 yards in width, but breakers extended over only one third of that space, in probably 2 or 3 fathoms water. The shoalest part was near the centre, where the sea broke ab. ruptly against a small rock which had apparently not more than 6 or 8 feet water on it.

As this reef lies in the direct track of vessels rounding the South East Isles, and is entirely under water, it is dangerous to approach in the night or in thick weather, for the soundings are deep close up to it. and give no warning of its vicinity.

The third South East Isle mentioned in the note upon Flinder's Chart does not exist.

IS Excellency the Governor has directed the publication of the following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next session.

#### By His Excellency's command, FRED. P. BARLEE,

Colonial Secretary.

A Bill to regulate the sale of spirituous and fermented liquors.

A Bill for consolidating and amending the laws relating to the Licensing of Public Houses and for further regulating the sale and consumption of fermented and spirituous liquors in the colony of Western Australia; and also for extending the powers of Justices with respect to drunkenness.

Of which the provisions are as follows-

Clause I., Section V. and other portions of No 3 of I841, No 8 of I841, No 3 of I843, No 7 of I847, No 1 of 1854, No 2 of 1855, No 11 of 1855, are repealed.

Clause II. Penalty on persons selling spi-rituous liquors, &c., without license prescribed by this Ordinance.

Clause III. Exceptions.

Clause IV. Licenses how issued; and what kind. To be in force for one year.

Clause V. As to a publican's general licence.

Clause VI. As to a wine and beer license. Clause VII. As to a packet license.

Clause VIII. As to a confectioner's license. Clause IX. Licenses may be extended pro tempore to fairs, &c., by authority of Petty Sessions.

Clause X. Disqualifications,

Clause XI. What Justices disgualified to

Clause XII. Governor may limit the number of licenses. How justices to proceed afterwards.

Clause XIII. As to notice of application for license.

Clause XXIV. Resident Magistrate or Po-Alce Magistrate may act if no others attend af-ter adjournment. Penalty for non-attendance. Clause XXV. Collector of Internal Re-

venue may issue packet licenses in special emergencies.

Clause XXVI. Governor may direct renewal of license without certificate in certain cases.

Clause XXVII. Majority of residing justices may specially recommend licenses at

any time. Clause XXVIII. Special Petty Sessions

for transferring licenses. Clause XXLX. Such Sessions may transfer licenses.

Clause XXX. Devolution of license on executors or trustees. Clause XXXI. Majority of residing Jus-

tices may transfer licenses at any time for special reasons.

Clause XXXII. Licensed persons desirous of removing to another house to memorialize Justices.

Clause XXXIII. Resident Magistrate or Police Magistrate to report transfers to the Collector of Internal Revenue.

Clause XXXIV. Penalties and disabilities for licensed persons offending. Justices may grant permission to keep a billiard table. Re-cognizances not to be forfeited unless upon

cognizances not to be forfeited unless upon adjudication of Quarter Sessions or Justices. Clause XXXV. Majority of Justices to exercise all the powers by this Ordinance vested in the Court of Quarter Sessions as far as regards declaring forfeitures of recog-

nizances, &c. Clause XXXVI. Publicans to have their n ames, &c., painted on their premises, and to keep a lamp burning over their doors during the night.

XXXVII. Unlicensed Clause persons

keeping up signs, &c', to be fined. Clause XXXVIII. Every licensed house to possess certain accommodation for travellers and guests

Clause XXXIX. Penalty for refusing entertainment.

Clanse XL. Immunity from distress for rent, &c., of strangers property. Clause XLI. No licensed house in Perth

and Fremantle or elsewhere as herein provided, to have any ingress or egress except in the streets named in the license.

Clause XLII. No action to be maintained on account of liquors illegally supplied nor in any case for spirits sold by retail except in part of inkeepers general bill. Clause XLIII. Licensed persons to receive

payment in money only. Clause XLIV. No licensed person to em-

ploy convicts in the management of the house.

Punishment for convicts selling liquors. Clause XLV. Restriction on receiving con-victs into licensed houses.

Clause XLVI. Penalty on licensed persons selling liquors to convicts without permission

of overseer, &c. Clause XLVII. Liquor not to be supplied

to soldiers after roll call. Clause XLVIII. As to supplying liquors

to aboriginal Natives.

Clause XLIX. Justices and authorised con-stables to have free ingress into licensed houses at all times.

Clause L. Public houses not to be open before or after certain hours. Magistrates may grant permission to keep house open after hours.

Clause LI. Penalty for publican's aban-doning the management of their houses.

doning the management of their houses. Chause LII. Penalty for employing un-licensed persons to retail liquors out of their houses or disposing of them for that purpose. Clause LIII. If the suspected that liquors are in any unlicensed house they may be seized and if after examination it shall so ap-pear, they shall be forfeited. Clause LIV. Liquors hawked about to be seized and condemned

seized and condemned. Clause LV. Spirituous liquors found in pos-session of holder of a wine and beer licerse to be seized and forfeited.

Clause LVI. All liquors belonging to persons convicted of illegally selling spirituous liquors to be liable to forfeiture. Clause LVII. Persons selling or offering

for sale adulterated liquors to be fined.

Clause LVIII. Persons not producing license to be deemed unlicensed.

Clause LIX. Mode of proving license.

Clause LX. Licenses to be produced on demand of Justice or authorised constable. Clause LXI. Persons drinking in unlicensed

houses to be apprehended. Clause LXII. Evidence sufficient to con-vict the owner and persons found drinking in

disorderly houses. Clause LXIII. Delivery of liquors to be prima facie evidence of sale.

Clause LXIV. Payment of wages where liquors are sold. Clause LXV. Justices may prohibit supply

of spirits, &c., to drunkards ; such prohibition renewable; penalty for disobedience by licensed persons.

Clause LXVI. Justices may imprison persons found drunk on a Sunday, Good Friday, or Christmas Day.

Clause LXVII. Convictions returnable to the Quarter Sessions and to be registered by the Clerk of the Peace. Record not to be essential as evidence of former con-viction at Petty Sessions.

Clause LXVIII. Penalty for constable ne-

glecting duty. Clause LXIX. Offences to be determined

summarily. Clause LXX. Penalty for witnesses not attending when summoned, or refusing to give evidence.

Clause LXXI. Persons aggrieved may ap-peal to Court of Quarter Sessions except in certain cases.
