Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUE EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependen. cies and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Ex. cellency Charles FitzGerald, Esquire, then Governor of the said colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the Eighteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled : -

No. 1.—An Ordinance to regulate the forms to be observed by Pardoned Convicts prior to their leaving the colony.

No 2.-An Ordinance to amend the Public House Licensing Ordinance 4th and 5th Vic. No 8.

No 4.-An Ordinance to amend the 16th Vict. No 4, commonly called the Branding Ordinance.

No 5.-An Ordinance to abolish Grand Juries and to substitute other provisions in lieu thereof.

No 8.-An Ordinance to amend the law relative to the Registration of Deeds, Conveyances Wills, Judgments, and affecting real property.

No 9.-An Ordinance for the further regulation of Practitioners in the Civil Court.

No 11.-An Ordinance for the better observance of the Lord's Day and the more effectual prevention of drunkenness. No 12 .- An Ordinance for the abolition of unnecessary oaths and to substitute declarations in lieu thereof.

No 13.-An Ordinance for the amendment of the Laws with respect to Wills.

No 14 - An Ordinance for the further amendment of the laws with respect to evidence.

No 15.-An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws for the regulation of Shipping and of Pilotage and other dues in the Harbours of Western Australia.

No 16.-An Ordinance to enable the denomination of Christians called Congregationalists in the colony of Western Australia to hold lands to raise a sum or sums of money on the security of such lands and for other purposes therein mentioned.

No 18.—An Ordinance to repeal the Ordinance No 19 of 1851, and to revise and amend certain parts of the Ordinance No 2 of 1833.

Now therefore, I Arthur Edward Keunedy do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.
