NCONVENIENCE having been experienced by the Employers of Ticket of-leave men in consequence of their Carters being obliged to obtain a Pass from a Magistrate to enable them to proceed to another district when in charge of their Teams, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of Free Settlers granting to their Ticket-of-leave Servants whom they may have occasion to send in charge of their Teams out of their own District, a Pass (for a term not exceeding 14 days) stating in writing where the team is going, and the date and place of granting the Pass (Albany and Port Gregory Districts excepted).

The Ticket-of-leave servant receiving such Pass is to present it to the Police of any place where he may be stopping, immediately after he has put up his team, and any ticket-of-leave holder neglecting so to do will be locked up by the Police and punished.

Free Settlers will see that it is to their own interest to enjoin obedience on their Ticket-of-leave servants to the last Clause.
