T is hereby notified for general infor-T is hereby notified to be Ordinance mation, pursuant to the Ordinance No 19 of the 10th Victoria, that a line of road from Toodyay Brook towards Bindoon has recently been laid out and Surveyed according to the following description, and that the same will henceforth be deemed a public line of communication.

INCONVENIENCE having been ex-perienced by the Employers of Ticket of-leave men in consequence of their Cart-

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ers being obliged to obtain a Pass from a Magistrate to enable them to proceed to another district when in charge of their Teams, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of Free Settlers granting to their Ticket-of-leave Servants whom they may have occasion to send in charge of their Teams out of their own District, a Pass (for a term not exceeding 14 days) stating in writing where the team is going, and the date and place of granting the Pass (Albany and Port Gregory Districts excepted).

The Ticket-of-leave servant receiving such Pass is to present it to the Police of any place where he may be stopping, im mediately after he has put up his team, and any ticket-of-leave holder neglecting so to do will be locked up by the Police and punished.

Free Settlers will see that it is to their own interest to enjoin obedience on their Ticket-of-leave servants to the last Clause.

Remission Certificates.

T is hereby notified for general information that all local restrictions hitherto in force respecting the receipt of Naval and Military Remission Certificates in the purchase of Waste Lands of the Crown are now removed, and that henceforth all such certificates will be receivable at the respective Revenue offices of this colony in payment for Land, under the same Regulations as apply to Remissions issued by the Government for any other consideration, except that Military and Nava! Remissions will not be transferable.
