By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esquire, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the first Section of an Ordinance to provide for the establishment of proper places for the burial of the dead, passed the 12th day of August, 1847, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, from time to time, to appoint, by Proclamation, such place or places in each District as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the burial of the dead, now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council do, by this my Proclamation, appoint the undermentioned places as Reserves for Public Cemeteries in the following towns and places respectively, but subject always to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same, that is to say:

Avon Location 202, near Nardie, for a General Cemetery between Northam and Toodyay Townsites.

Northam Lot N47 for Roman Catholics.

Ditto N48 for Independents.

Ditto N49 for Wesleyans.

Ditto N50 for Church of England and Ireland.

Bejoording Lot B1 for Ditto.

Bejoording Lot B2 for Wesleyans.

Ditto B3 for Independents.

Ditto B4 for Roman Catholics.

Wonnerup Lot 43 for Church of England and Ireland.

Ditto 44 for Wesleyans.

Ditto 45 for Independents.

Ditto 46 for Roman Catholics.

Coolingup Lot 67 for Church of England and Ireland.

Ditto 68 for Wesleyans.

Ditto 69 for Independents.

Ditto 70 for Roman Catholics.

Regulations for the guidance of District Registrars of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of Western Australia.

EVERY District Registrar is to make known as generally as possible the provisions of the Colonial Ordinance No 12 of the 19th Victoria, and see that the regulations contained therein for the due registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages are strictly enforced.

District Registrars will use due diligence in keeping themselves informed of all Births, Deaths, or Marriages occurring in their respective Districts; and, in the event of their registration being respectively, wilfully, or negligently withheld, will cause the offender to be summoned before the two nearest Justices of the Peace with a view to such punishment being awarded as to the Bench may seem fit.

The attention of District Registrars is called to the necessity of obtaining the fullest information in regard to Births. The date and place of Birth should be given together with the Profession, Trade, or Calling, of the Father and the informant should not only be called upon to sign the Register, but to add also his or her place of residence and calling; and, if he or she be related to the child, the degree of relationship should be mentioned. The legitimacy or otherwise of the child should be ascertained by the District Registrar, and in the latter case duly reported to the Registrar General. The registration of still born children is also required.

Similar importance attaches to obtaining particulars in regard to Deaths. The age of any deceased person, the date and place of death and the nature of the disease which terminated his or her existence should be carefully ascertained in a registered.

District Registrars are particularly enjoined to fill up the duplicate certificates, to be transmitted to the Registrar General, in a clear and legible manner, as the names of parties, although familiar in the

Districts where they reside, are unknown to the Registrar General, and often from the careless manner in which the Certificates are filled up, cannot be deciphered at the General Registry.

The attention of District Registrars is called to the 32nd Section of the Registration Ordinance.
