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BY virtue of a Proclamation bearing date 16th August, 1856, under the hand of His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor, and the Public Seal of the colony of Western Australia, the following Land will be offered for sale at public auction, by the Collector and Sub-Collector of Revenue at the following places and times at 1 o'clock p.m., at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations, dated 14th June, 1841:

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, ESQUIRE, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the first Section of an Ordinance to provide for the establishment of proper places for the burial of the dead, passed the 12th day of August, 1847, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, from time to time, to appoint, by Proclamation, such place or places in each District as shall be deemed expedient to be reserved for the burial of the dead, now, therefore, I, the Governor,

with the advice of the Executive Council do, by this my Proclamation, appoint the undermentioned places as Reserves for Public Cemeteries in the following towns and places respectively, but subject always to such regulations as may be published from time to time for the proper management of the same, that is to say:

Avon Location 202, near Nardie, for a General Cemetery between Northam and Toodyay Townsites.
 Northam Lot N47 for Roman Catholics.
 Ditto N48 for Independents.
 Ditto N49 for Wesleyans.
 Ditto N50 for Church of England and Ireland.

Bejoording Lot B1 for Ditto.
 Bejoording Lot B2 for Wesleyans.
 Ditto B3 for Independents.
 Ditto B4 for Roman Catholics.
 Wonnerup Lot 43 for Church of England and Ireland.
 Ditto 44 for Wesleyans.
 Ditto 45 for Independents.
 Ditto 46 for Roman Catholics.
 Coolingnup Lot 67 for Church of England and Ireland.
 Ditto 68 for Wesleyans.
 Ditto 69 for Independents.

IT having come to His Excellency the
Governor's knowledge that Whale
Boats have, contrary to the Regulations,
gone into the Bay at Rottnest and held
communication with persons residing on the
Island, notice is hereby given that any per-
son in future offending in like manner
will be punished as provided for by Colo-
nial Ordinance No 1 of 4th Vic. A copy
of the penal clause in which, is sub-
joined for general information—

CLAUSE.

¶ II.—And be it enacted, that it shall be
lawful for the Governor or Officer Ad-
ministering the Government of the said
colony by and with the advice and consent
of the Executive Council thereof from
time to time to alter and establish by
Proclamation the bounds and extent of
the said Prison, so as to limit it to any
portion of the said Island, if at any time
it should be deemed expedient so to do,
and also to make all such precautionary
rules and regulations touching the places
and times, and manner of landing of
Boats at the said Island as may be
thought necessary for the due custody and
prevention of the escape of the prisoners
and any person who shall be convicted be

fore any two Justices of the Peace of ha-
ving wilfully contravened any of the or-
ders and regulations contained in any
such Proclamation issued for any of the
purposes aforesaid shall forfeit and pay
any sum not less than one pound, nor
more than Ten Pounds, or in default
thereof shall be committed to prison for
any period not less than seven days nor
more than three calendar months."
