Pastoral and Tillage Lands.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,

THE holders of Pastoral and Tillage Leases are hereby reminded of the

following Regulations which will come into operation on the 1st day of January next:—

"All rents and fees chargeable on 8 years leases after the first year, will be due on the 1st day of January in each year, and must be paid yearly in advance on or before the 15th of that month, to the Collector of Internal Revenue, or to any Sub-Collector nearest to the district in which the land may be situated.

"If such rents and charges be not paid as herein required, the lease will be absolutely and indefeasibly forfeited, unless within 60 days after the first of January the lessee shall duly pay the full amount of the annual rent, together with an additional sum, equal to one-fourth part of the same.

"The legal occupants of lands in fee-simple will be entitled to a preference in obtaining annual licences of the vacant lands in Class A, adjoining to, and within one mile of, their respective grants, and in proportion to the size of each of such grants, should there be more than one claimant for the same land.

"All vacant land in Class A., beyond one mile from land in fee-simple, will be open at all times to general application for annual license; as well as all vacant land in Class A., not claimed under the preceding regulation on or before the 1st day of December in each year.

"No renewal of an annual license in Class A. can be claimed, but licenses for the succeeding year will be granted preferably to existing lessees, with or without amended boundaries, in the absence of any stronger recognised claim.

"Should a modification of boundaries to any such runs be desired previous to renewal, application for the same must be made to the Surveyor-General not later in each year than the end of November.

Application for renewals, or for new Leases or Licenses from the 1st of Janu-

any next, must be sent in to the Surveyor General in the established printed forms by the 1st of December, on which date they will be taken into consideration.

Parties claiming class A licenses in right of being the occupants or owners of adjoining fee simple lands, must in their applications refer distinctly to the lands in right of which they found their claims.

No Class A. License will be issued, either for the whole or any portion of the year, for a less sum than £1.

The printed forms are procurable at the Survey Office, or from any Resident Magistrate, without charge.

Leases of Land the Regulations of October 16, 1855, relative to altering the boundaries of Pastoral Leases, the following are the Rules under which any such desired changes can be effected:—

1. Any alterations which a Lessee may require in the boundaries of a Tillage Lease will, if approved, be granted only on payment of a fine of £5 for a new Lease.

2. Such fine must be paid at the time of sending in the written application to the Surveyor General, and will be returned if the application cannot be complied with.

3. The old Lease must be delivered in to the Survey Office for cancellation previous to a new Lease being issued.

4. Leases will be deliverable at the Revenue Offices only.

5. A new or amended Lease will expire on the same date as that which it may be intended to supersede.

WARRANT.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, ESQUIRE, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by the 49th section of an Ordinance passed in the 17th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the general Regulation of the Customs in Western Australia," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Go-

vernor with the advice of his Executive Council by his Warrant from time to time to appoint Ports in the said Colony which shall be Warehousing Ports: Be it therefore known unto all men that I the Governor aforesaid, have with the advice of my Executive Council, appointed and do hereby appoint the Ports of Bunbury and Vasse, respectively as Ports at which advalorem goods may be bonded for payment of duty thereat.

Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS it is enacted by the 4th section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th Year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No 12, entitled "An Ordinance for the better Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, in the colony of Western Australia," that the Governor may for the purposes of such Ordinance divide the said colony into such and so many Registry Districts as he shall think fit, one of them being the Registry District of Perth, and may in like manner by any subsequent Proclamation from time to time alter such division. Now, therefore, I, Arthur Edward Kennedy, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of my Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that in addition to the Districts already proclaimed, the District of "Gingin," according to the following boundaries, shall be considered a Registry District for the purposes of the said Ordinance, viz. :—

Bounded on the South by a line from Goyamin to Chandala Spring and thence due West to the Sea coast.

On the East by a line from Goyamin to Bindoon, and thence to Mouerin on the Moore River.

On the North by a line from Mouerin to Gilgin Pool in the Moore and thence due West to the sea coast.

On the West by the sea coast.
