Breadth, 5 feet

Depth, 1 foot 10 inches.

The Boat to be slincher built, keel, gunwales, stem and stern post to be mahogany. Planking, thwarts, rising and lining to be Pine.

Keel to be 3 inches in depth clear of garbard streak.

Stern post to be straight with rudder and tiller.

Floors between every two timbers, close lining up to rising, with mast step, mast thwart to be double kneed with 3 inch hole for mast.

The whole to be copper fastened, and covered with two coats of lead color paint,

Hoisting straps forward and aft to be fitted, and four iron crutches to be provided.
