Prepayment of Letters to the United Kingdom.

IT is hereby notified for general information that from and after this date Letters for the United Kingdom must in all cases be prepaid, and will be subject to the despatch rate of Postage only. Letters duly posted in any part of the United

Kingdom will likewise be delivered in any part of Western Australia free of charge.

Letters via Marseilles.

The Postage upon Letters for transmission by the above route has been reduced from 5d to 3d the quarter ounce, exclusive of the colonial rate; which rate must also be paid in advance.

Book Packets.

The Postage upon Book Packets for transmission by the overland route via Southampton has been increased from 6d to 8d the single rate, increasing at the rate of 1s 4d per lb.
