Proclamation.

By His Excellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esq., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Ex-

cellency ARTHUR EDWARD KENNEDY, Esquire, Governor, of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 19th and 20th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled :—
19th Victoria.

No. 4—An Ordinance to abolish the franking of Letters and Packets.

No. 5—An Ordinance to empower the Governor to Alienate Lands in Western Australia purchased out of Imperial or Colonial Funds.

No. 6—An Ordinance to enable the Total Abstinence Society in Western Australia to raise a sum of £300 on their Lands.

No. 7—An Ordinance for the Naturalization of Charles Millar.

No. 8—An Ordinance to substitute other punishment in lieu of Transportation.

No. 9—An Ordinance to repeal the Small Savings Ordinance No. 3, 1855.

No. 10—An Ordinance to facilitate enquiries in the nature of Coronors Inquests.

No. 13—An Ordinance for the relief of Creditors against Persons removing from one Australian Colony to another.

No. 14—An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Registration of Deeds, Wills, Judgments, and Conveyances, affecting real Property.

No. 15—An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws respecting the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen.

No. 16—An Ordinance to repeal an Ordinance passed in the 17th year of the reign of Her present Majesty No. 14, imposing Duties on imported Goods, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof.

20th Victoria.

No. 2—An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Sale of Spirituous and Fermented Liquors.

No. 3—An Ordinance to provide for the Payment of certain unforeseen expenses in the year 1856; and also to provide for the appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1857.

No. 4—An Ordinance to provide for an excess of Expenditure in the year 1855 over and above the Estimates for the same.

No. 5—An Ordinance for the more Speedy Trial and Punishment of Offences in certain cases of Larceny.

Now, therefore, I, Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.

HER Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies having been pleased to authorise His Excellency the Governor to announce that the payment of Passage Money will not in future be required from Ticket-of-Leave holders, and also to remit any outstanding arrears, under such regulations of detail, as he may deem proper under the circumstances.

His Excellency is pleased to direct that the date on which such payment shall be considered to have ceased, shall be the 28th FEBRUARY, 1857; and that all sums due up to that date, shall be required from Ticket-of-Leave holders, prior to their receiving their Conditional Pardons, except in those cases in which he may be recommended by the Comptroller General of Convicts to remit the same.

All Ticket-of-Leave holders who have paid more than would have become due on the 28th February, 1857, at the rate of £5 per annum will have such over payment refunded to them on application to the Commissariat in the District to which they belonged at the above date; where there is no Commissariat, as at Toodyay, York, Port Gregory, and Champion Bay, the sums will be repaid by the Comptroller General through the Resident Magistrate and vouchers forwarded for signature at the time of payment.

SIR,—Referring to preceding Notices of the periods which had been fixed for the examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, I now transmit to you a notification, to which you will give all

due publicity, of a similar examination which is to take place in July, 1857.

CIVIL SERVICE OF THE EAST INDIA COMPANY.

1. In July, 1857, an examination will take place of candidates for appointments to the Civil Service of the East India Company. Notice will be hereafter given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of the East India Company, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, before the 1st of May, 1857, have transmitted to the India Board, Cannon Row, Westminster:—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age, on the 1st of May, 1857, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-three years.

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of the East India Company.

(c) A certificate of good moral character, signed by the head of the school or college at which he has last received his education; or, if he has not received education at any school or college since the year 1854, then such proof of good moral character as may be satisfactory to the Board of Commissioners for the affairs of India.

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

English Language and Literature—

4. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, according to the ordinary system in use at several of the Universities; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding paragraph denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

5. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall obtain, in respect of that subject, one-sixth of the number of marks set against that particular subject.

6. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *viva voce* examination.

7. After the examination shall have been completed, the marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the twelve candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit; and those twelve candidates will be appointed to the Civil Service of the East India Company, in the Presidency of Bengal, provided they comply with the regulations in force at the time for the said Service.

8. The Commissioners for the affairs of India will be ready to receive, at any time previous to the 1st of May, 1857, the testimonials of persons desirous of being appointed to the office of Examiner; but no such appointment will be made until after the date above mentioned.
