Pastoral and Tillage Lands.

Colonial Secreta y's Office, Perth, October 12, 1857.

THE following Regulations, applicable to Pastoral and Tillage lands are republished for general information :--

All rents and fees chargeable on 8 years leases after the first year, will be due on the 1st of January in each year and must be paid yearly in advance on or before the 15th of that month, to the Collector of Internal Revenue or to any Sub-Collector nearest to the district in which the land may be situated.

If such rents and charges be not paid as herein required, the lease will be absolutely and indefeasibly forfeited, unless within 60 days after the first of January the lessee shall duly pay the full amount of the annual rent, together with an additional sum equal to one-fourth part of the same.

The legal occupants of lands infee simple will be entitled to a preference in obtaining annual licenses of the vacant lands in Class A, adjoining to, and within one mile of their respective grants, and in proportion to the size of each of such grants, should there be more than one claimant for the same land.

All vacant land in Class A, beyond one mile from land in fee simple, will be open at all times to general application for annual license, as well as all vacant land in Class A not claimed under t^{j} e preceding regulation on or before the 1st day of December in each year.

No renewal of an annual license in Class A can be *claimed*, but licenses for the succeeding year will be granted preferably to existing lessees, with or without amended boundaries, in the absence of any stronger recognised claim.

Should a modification of boundaries to any such run be desired previous to renewal, application for the same must be made to the Surveyor General not later in each year than the end of November.

Applications for renewals or for new Leases or Licenses from the 1st of January next, must be sent in to the Surveyor General in the established printed forms by the 1st of December, on which date they will be taken into consideration.

Parties claiming Class A licenses in right of being the occupants or owners of adjoining fee simple lands must, in their applications, refer distinctly to the lands in right of which they found their claims.

No Class A licenses will be issued either for tle whole, or any portion of the year, for a less sum than L.l.

Pending the decision of Her Majesty's Government on the proposed New Land Regulations, no tillage leases or pastoral leases of land in Class B, will be granted for a longer period than the currrent year.

Such yearly leases will be granted without any abatement for unavailable land, and without any right of renewal, but His Excellency the Governor will be prepared on application to grant to existing lessees fresh leases for another year of the same lands, and on the same terms and conditions, until New Regulations may be promulgated in the Colony.

Lessees under these conditions will then be entitled to claim an exchange of their leases for others, under such New Regulations as may be approved by Her Majesty's Government.

The full amount of rent chargeable for an annual lease, must be paid to the Revenue Department before a lease can be prepared for signature.

Printed forms of application are procu-rable at the Survey Office, or from any Resident Magistrate, without charge.

IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Act of Uniformity, which establisheth the Lithurgy, and enacts, that no Form or Order of Common Prayer be openly used other than what is prescribed or appointed to be used in and by the said Book, it is notwithstanding provided, that in all those Prayers, Litanies, and Collects which do anywise relate to the King, Queen, or Royal Progeny, the Names be altered and changed from time to time, and fitted to the present occasion, according to the direction of lawful authority: Her Majesty was pleased this day in Council to declare Her Royal Will and Pleasuro that in all Prayers, Litanies, and Collects for the Royal Family the words "The Printe Consort" be inserted instead of the words " The Prince Albert."

And Her Majesty doth strictly charge and command, that no Edition of the Com-mon Prayer be from henceforth printed but with this Amendment; and in the meantime, till copies of such edition may be had, all Parsons, Vicars, and Curates within this Realm do (for the preventing of mistakes), with the pon, correct and amend all such Prayers in their Church Books, according to the foregoing directions : and for the better notice hereof, that this order be forthwith printed and published, and sent to the several parishes; and that the Right Reverend the Bishops do take care that Obedience be paid to do take caro the same accordingly.
