The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of any Mail contract until the bond shall have been respectively signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the Mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The contractors are to convey and deliver all Mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters and to provide secure and water-tight lockers for Mails in carts, and coverings for the bags on horseback; the contractors moreover will be bound not to convey themselves or their servants, any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office revenue, under a penalty of Three Pounds for each offence, which penalty will be deducted from their monthly pay. The whole of the Mails (excepting Al-

bany) may be conveyed either in spring carts or on horseback at the option of the contractor.

The persons employed by any of the contractors to convey Mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General, both as to age and character.

Pastoral and Tillage Lands.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, October 12, 1857.

THE following Regulations, applicable to Pastoral and Tillage lands are republished for general information :-

All rents and fees chargeable on 8 years leases after the first year, will be due on the Ist of January in each year and must be paid yearly in advance on or before the 15th of that month, to the Collector of Internal Revenue or to any Sub-Collector nearest to the district in which the land may be situated.

If such rents and charges be not paid as herein required, the lease will be absolutely and indefeasibly forfeited, unless within 60 days after the first of January the lessee shall duly pay the full amount of the an-nual rent, together with an additional sum equal to one-fourth part of the same.

The legal occupants of lands infee simple will be entitled to a preference in obtaining annual licenses of the vacant lands in Class A, adjoining to, and within one mile of their respective grants, and in propor-tion to the size of each of such grants, should there be more than one claimant for the same land.

All vacant land in Class A, beyond one mile from land in fee simple, will be open at all times to general application for an-nual license, as well as all vacant land in Class A not claimed under the preceding regulation on or before the 1st day of December in each year.

No renewal of an annual license in Class A can be *claimed*, but licenses for the succeeding year will be granted preferably to existing lessees, with or without amended boundaries, in the absence of any stronger recognised claim.

Should a modification of boundaries to any such run be desired previous to renewal, application for the same must be made to the Surveyor General not later in each year than the end of November.

Applications for renewals or for new Leases or Licenses from the 1st of January next, must be sent in to the Surveyor General in the established printed forms by the 1st of December, on which date they will be taken into consideration.

Parties claiming Class A licenses in right of being the occupants or owners of adjoining fee simple lands must, in their applications, refer distinctly to the lands in right of which they found their claims.

No Class A licenses will be issued either for the whole, or any portion of the year, for a less sum than L.1.

Pending the decision of Her Majesty's Government on the proposed New Land Regulations, no tillage leases or pastoral leases of land in Class B, will be granted for a longer period than the current year. Such yearly leases will be granted with-

out any abatement for unavailable land, and without any right of renewal, but His Excellency the Governor will be prepared on application to grant to existing lessees fresh leases for another year of the same lands, and on the same terms and conditions, until New Regulations may be promulgated in the Colony.

Lessees under these conditions will then be entitled to claim an exchange of their leases for others, under such New Regulations as may be approved by Her Majesty's Government.

The full amount of rent chargeable for an annual lease, must be paid to the Revenue Department before a lease can be prepared for signature.
