PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY, Arthur Edward Kennedy Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Local Ordinance was passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof in the 20th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled,

“ No. VIII. An Ordinance to empower the Governor of Western Australia to purchase certain certificates of remission in the price of Crown Lands.”

Now therefore, I the said Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinance.

NOTICE.

WITH a view to accelerating the delivery of correspondence despatched from this Colony to the United Kingdom, *via* Suez by the Contract Packets, it has been determined by Her Majesty's Postmaster General to open the mails on board the Steamers by which they are conveyed from

Alexandria to Malta, and to effect a partial or complete sorting of the Letters and Newspapers, as may be found practicable. To meet however any objection that has been raised to the plan of sorting on board, on the ground of the opportunity it would afford for tampering with Letters, it is intended by the regulations that all *Registered Letters* shall be sent in a separate mail, and that that mail shall not be opened until it arrives in London. Persons wishing their Letters not to be overhauled on board the Packets are requested to have them Registered.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHTHOUSES AT KING GEORGE'S SOUND, WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

FOR the guidance of Shipping frequenting King George's Sound, a lighthouse has been erected on the summit of Breaksea Island at the entrance of the Sound, and another at the entrance to Princess Royal Harbour.

A light is exhibited in both between sunset and sunrise.

That on Breaksea Island is a good Cateoptric light of the 2nd order, white, fixed, and elevated 383 feet above sea level. It may consequently be seen in clear weather at the distance of 9 leagues, from an elevation of 12 feet above the water.

The octagonal iron tower which carries this light is erected near the centre of the island, which is $1\frac{3}{4}$ miles in length E. by S. and W. by N., with an average width of nearly a quarter of a mile. From Breaksea light the extremity of Bald Head bears South 40 degrees West 3 miles, Cape Vancouver at the foot of Mount Gardner East 15 degrees North 7 miles, and the light at the entrance of Princess Royal Harbour West 20 degrees North $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles. By a vessel from the Westward the light may first be seen round the steep slope of

Bald Head on the bearing of N. E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E., just open to the South of the Eclipse Islands. These bearings are magnetic.

The light at Princess Royal Harbour is on Point King, the North point of its narrow entrance. It is a fixed white light of the same description as that on Breaksea, but smaller, and is elevated 37 feet above high water. From the mid channel between Breaksea and Michaelmas Islands this light bears W. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., and from the N.E. extremity of Bald Head N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. It is carried by a wooden square tower 17 feet in height, and 37 feet from the water's edge. All bearings magnetic.
