**N**OTICE is hereby given that a proposed public line of communication having been laid out and marked between the towns of Bunbury and Australind in pursuance of the provisions of the Ordinances 10th Vict. No. 19, and 12th Vict. No. 23, His Excellency the Governor directs the following description of such proposed line to be notified.

Description of a Public road or line of communication between Bunbury and Australind.

The Road is one chain wide on the North and Western side of the following lines, which are described by their true bearings, and are marked at their several angles of intersection by stout squared posts.

Commencing at a post on the South boundary of Bunbury Townsite near left bank of Meredith Creek, the road extends seven chains East, twenty six degrees forty four minutes South then 30 chains.

**I**T having come to the knowledge of the Governor that Convicts, illegally at large, have been fed and harboured by Ticket-of-Leave Holders and others, His Excellency directs the publication of the following Section of the Ordinance of 14th Victoria, No. 6., which will be put in force against any person convicted of offending against the same—

## 14TH VICTORIA, No. 6., SECTION XIII.

AND be it enacted, that any free person who shall knowingly harbour any Convict, who shall be illegally at large, shall, on summary conviction for such offence before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty Pounds; and in default of payment thereof, shall be imprisoned for any term not exceeding six calendar months, with or without hard labour; and if the person guilty of such offence be himself a Convict on Ticket-of-Leave, he shall on summary conviction before one or more Justice or Justices of the Peace, be punished with whipping, not exceeding one hundred lashes, or, at the discretion of the convicting Justice or Justices, with hard labour, in or out of Irons, on the roads or other public works of the said Colony, for any time not exceeding twelve Calendar months.
