The following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next Session are published for general information.

# PUBLIC BILLS.

BILL for the further appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1857, and for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1859.

A BILL to prevent the evasion of the Passenger Act and to regulate the licensing of Passage Brokers.

A BILL to legalize the acts of all persons who have exercised the functions of Sheriff in Western Australia since the 27th day of May 1835 and to indemnify and discharge them from all Suits, Prosecutions, or Liabilities incident thereto or connected therewith and to provide for the better appointment of such Officers for the time to come.

A BILL to amend the Customs Law.

A BILL for the incorporation and regulation of Joint Stock Companies and other Associations and for limiting the liabilities of members of certain of the same.

A BILL to alter the existing Law providing for the Improvement of the City of Perth and to make other regulations instead thereof.

A BILL to provide for a system of passports in the Colony of Western Australia.

A BILL to amend an Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Sale of Spirituous and fermented liquors.

A BILL for vesting Church of England lands in Western Australia in the Lord Bishop of Perth and his Successors.

A BILL to alter and amend the Law for regulating the Constitution of Juries and for the trial of Issues in certain cases in the Criminal and Civil Courts of Western Australia.

A BILL to legalize the acts of all persons who have exercised the functions of Registrar of Deeds and Transfers in Western Australia since the sixth day of March, 1832, and to indemnify and discharge them from all Suits, Prosecutions, or Liabilities incident thereto, or connected therewith, and to provide for the better appointment of such Officer for the time to come.
